

HOME OCCUPATION REGULATIONS



ARE THERE ANY OTHER HOME OCCUPATION APPROVAL REQUIREMENTS THAT MUST BE MET?

Yes, in addition to completing a Business License application, all Home Occupation applicants must also complete a Home Occupation Supplemental Questionnaire that will be reviewed by the City of Dublin Planning Division.

Based on the answers provided, a City Planner will determine if the proposed Home Occupation complies with all of the “limitations on use” of the Home Occupations Ordinance (DMC 8.64).

WHAT ARE SOME OF THE “LIMITATIONS ON USE” REQUIREMENTS?

Some of the “limitations on use” taken into consideration by the Planning Division for a Home Occupation would include, but are not solely limited to, the following:

- Number and size of all vehicles associated with the home occupation.
- Employees associated with the Home Occupation.
- Associated storage of materials, merchandise, supplies, and equipment.
- Pedestrian and vehicular traffic associated with the Home Occupation.
- Sign advertising associated of the Home Occupation.
- Will the Home Occupation create a public nuisance?
- Hours of operation for some types of Home Occupations.
- Compliance with all applicable City, County, State and Federal codes or laws.
- Prohibition of onsite sales and services.
- Number of students associated with tutoring.

If a Home Occupation Business License has been denied for failing to meet any of the “limitation on use” requirements, the applicant will be notified and provided with the reasons for denial.

WHAT TYPES OF HOME OCCUPATIONS ARE PROHIBITED?

The following types of Home Occupations are prohibited in the City of Dublin:

- Adult Business Establishments
- Appliance Repair Shops
- Auto, Body and Re-upholstery Repair
- Carpentry and Cabinet Making
- Dance and Night Clubs
- Eating and drinking establishments
- Fortune Telling
- Grooming, Breeding, Boarding, Training and Raising of Animals
- Medical and Dental Offices
- Mini-Storage
- Personal Services (excluding tutoring)
- Welding and Machine Shops
- Other types as determined by the Director of Community Development.

IS A COTTAGE FOOD OPERATION OR LARGE FAMILY DAY CARE HOME ALSO CONSIDERED A HOME OCCUPATION?

Yes. In addition to securing a separate Zoning Clearance for the use, a Home Occupation business license must also be approved. These two types of Home Occupations are only subject to the provisions of DMC 8.65 (Cottage Food Operations) or DMC 8.66 (Large Family Day Care Homes).
