

Businesses are growing in the New American Backyard! The City of Dublin is proud to announce the addition of two new restaurants, which will bring new options to Dublin's thriving food scene: Market Tavern and Lucille's Smokehouse Bar-B-Que.

Market Tavern plans to open its second location in Hacienda Crossings, in the former site of Mimi's Café. Market Tavern is an innovative concept that provides locally-sourced and sustainable foods and ingredients, such as local produce and libations, in a "grab-and-go" market setting, plus offers a high-quality, sit-down restaurant and bar experience with many modern, new American classics. The first location was opened in Lincoln Center in Stockton in 2013. The Dublin location is expected to open in Spring 2018 following extensive interior improvements.

Lucille's Smokehouse Bar-B-Que will soon join Dublin's Downtown District, in the former Elephant Bar site on Amador Plaza Road. Lucille's driving philosophy is, "Serving the best Bar-B-Que with the finest southern hospitality." Lucille's founder Craig Hofman opened the first of his many restaurants in Long Beach, California, in

1999, after spending several years on a tour of Southern barbeque. Tenant improvements will begin later this summer, with a tentative opening in early 2018.
