

WHAT ARE THE GUIDELINES FOR DISPLAYING POLITICAL CAMPAIGN SIGNS?

Political campaign signs identifying a political candidate or ballot measure are subject to the following four requirements applicable to all temporary non-commercial signs:

1. The sign may be only be placed private property with permission of the property owner.
2. The sign may be displayed up to sixty (60) days. For reference, a sign removed on the day of the November 5, 2024 general election may be displayed no earlier than September 6, 2024.
3. The maximum size of each sign is sixteen (16) square feet per side, the aggregate of all temporary non-commercial signs on a lot, including political campaign signs, may not exceed eighty (80) square feet.



4. No sign may be placed within any public right-of-way, or within 660 feet of I-580 or I-680 if the sign would be visible from the interstate highway right-of-way.

ENFORCEMENT

No political campaign sign or other temporary non-commercial sign

may be attached to or erected on public property, including streets, sidewalks, utility poles, signs, fences, open space areas, and parks.

Prohibited signs placed on public property will be removed by the City of Dublin.

Prohibited signs on private property must be removed by the property owner and/or responsible candidate/ballot measure as directed by the City.

Please note that some signs, including signs extending above a roofline and any sign that creates a traffic hazard, are prohibited pursuant to Chapter 8.84 of the Dublin Municipal Code.
