Located at the Dublin Transit Center, the “Dubliner” is made of brushed stainless-steel rods, the sculpture’s volume catches sunlight during the day and transforms itself into a column of colored light at night. It is illuminated with LED light on the interior and metal halide lights on the exterior. When seen from a distance, especially at night, it is a beacon. Another layer of interest appears when the illuminated sculpture is viewed by the pedestrian standing directly beneath it. The illuminated colored outline of a series of shamrocks are the stabilizing and shape giving elements of the sculpture that can be seen. This intimate moment of discovery adds interest and playfulness to the urban station and imbeds the history of the City and its urban fabric.
