January 11, 2021 Special Notice

State of California Shelter-in-Place Extended

Due to a severe decrease in ICU capacity across the Bay Area and other regions, the State of California extended its current Shelter-in-Place Order for the region until further notice. With current ICU capacity at just three-percent, and COVID cases on the rise, the State could not estimate how long the current Order will last.

In Alameda County, the State's [Regional Stay Home Order](#) framework has been in place since December 7, 2020.

Paycheck Protection Program Re-Opening Updated Application Forms Now Available



The Small Business Administration (SBA) has announced that the Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) will re-open this week for new borrowers and certain existing PPP borrowers can apply for a Second Draw PPP Loan.

To promote access to capital, initially only community financial institutions (CDFIs) will be able to make First Draw PPP Loans starting on Monday, January 11, and Second Draw PPP Loans starting on Wednesday, January 13. The PPP will then open to all participating lenders shortly thereafter.

Updated PPP guidance outlining Program changes to enhance its effectiveness and accessibility was released on January 6 in accordance with the Economic Aid to Hard-Hit Small Businesses, Non-Profits, and Venues Act.

Key PPP updates include:

- PPP borrowers can set their PPP loan's covered period to be any length between eight and 24 weeks to best meet their business needs;
- PPP loans will cover additional expenses, including operations expenditures, property damage costs, supplier costs, and worker protection expenditures;
- PPP's eligibility is expanded to include 501(c)(6)s, housing cooperatives,

- destination marketing organizations, among other types of organizations;
- PPP provides greater flexibility for seasonal employees;
- Certain existing PPP borrowers can request to modify their First Draw PPP Loan amount; and
- Certain existing PPP borrowers are now eligible to apply for a Second Draw PPP Loan.

How To Apply

You can apply through a participating bank, credit union, CDFI, etc. If you wish to begin preparing your application, you can download the following PPP borrower application forms to see the information that will be requested from you when you apply with a lender. Note: Your lender may have their own form.
