The total population numbers are from California's adjusted 2020 Census data. The CVAP (Citizen Voting Age Population) data are from the 2016-2020 Special Tabulation data from the US Census Bureau. Age, Immigration, and other demographics are from the 2015-2019 American Community Survey 5-year data. Live Answer: The Census generally only uses visible boundaries (like streets) and political boundaries (like city borders). This means many subdivisions that back into each other are placed in a single Census block. Live Answer: All maps that we receive will be made public. They will all go into the public record and the council will have all publicly submitted maps to consider at City Council meetings on this topic. That, however, doesn't mean that all maps submitted will be legal maps, it is the demographer's job to analyze maps for compliance with applicable laws. Additionally there are generally 2 to 4 NDC map submissions. the NDC maps are not necessarily better than publicly submitted maps.
