



Snowflake Inc. Expands Footprint in Dublin



Snowflake Inc., the Data Cloud Company, has expanded its footprint in Dublin by signing a long-term lease at the Dublin Corporate Center campus. Snowflake is increasing its square footage to 153,000 square feet, occupying the 4140 Dublin Boulevard building.

This expansion demonstrates Snowflake's commitment to Dublin and is expected to bring more than 500 new jobs to the Tri-Valley region in the coming years. In June, the Innovation Tri-Valley Leadership Group announced that the number of tech businesses in the Bay Area's Tri-Valley region had increased more than 60% in the last four years, with some Bay Area's most disruptive innovation coming out of the area encompassing the cities of Dublin, Livermore, Pleasanton, San Ramon, and the Town of Danville.

Snowflake's growth supports these claims in demonstrating the continued acceleration of tech businesses in the region.

"Snowflake is at the forefront of digital transformation, accelerating its growth trajectory to stay ahead of the evolving landscape and meet the needs of its customer and partner ecosystem," said Warrick Taylor, VP, Global Workplace and Real Estate at Snowflake.

All Business Electricity Accounts Transition to Renewable



In April 2022, the Dublin City Council voted to set the **default electricity service for Dublin businesses to East Bay Community Energy (EBCE) Renewable 100 starting in October 2022**. Renewable 100 electricity is sourced from California wind and solar facilities, including EBCE's new wind farm in Livermore. All municipal accounts have been on Renewable 100 since July 2019 and residential customers in Dublin were placed on Renewable 100 in January 2022.

EBCE will be hosting a series of webinars in September to review the basics of their service and to answer any questions about the transition to Renewable 100. Details on the transition to Renewable 100, including how to opt-out of the transition, will be available at www.ebce.org/Dublin beginning in August 2022.

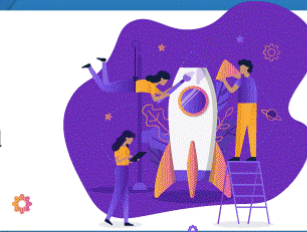

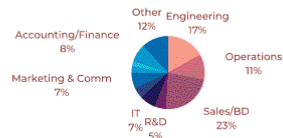

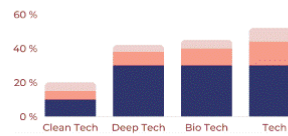

California's Mandatory Alcohol Server Training Law Goes into effect July 1, plus New Online Services

Alcoholic Beverage Control

The **California Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control** implemented the Responsible Beverage Service (RBS) Training Program to teach servers to responsibly serve alcoholic beverages for on-premises consumption and mitigate alcohol-related harm in California communities.

Beginning July 1, 2022, any on-premise alcohol server and manager must be certified by an accredited RBS training provider and pass an ABC exam within 60 calendar days from the first date of employment.

The California Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control (ABC) announces new online services to help make doing business easier for more than 93,000 businesses in California. ABC's Online Services is a place where licensees can come and conduct business online with the Department from anywhere and at any time. Online services for licensees include:

- Manage a license
- Renew a license
- Become RBS server certified
- Maintain RBS server roster
- Apply to be an RBS Training Provider

California Competes Tax Credit Opens Application Periods for Fiscal Year 2022-23



The **California Competes Tax Credit** is an income tax credit available to businesses that want to locate in California or stay and grow in California and create quality, full-time jobs in California that might not otherwise be created by the business or any other business. The program also includes the **California Competes Grant Program**. A total of \$304 million in California Competes Tax Credit and a total of \$120 million in California Competes Grant funding is available for allocation in the 2022-2023 fiscal year. The first application period started July 25, 2022, with \$85 million in tax credits and \$120 million in grants available.

2022 County of Alameda Licensed Provider Grant

The County of Alameda has announced the investment of **\$4 million to the local Early Care and Education (ECE) system for existing infrastructure needs and capacity building of the field**. One-time grants will be awarded to eligible licensed Family Child Care (FCC) and Center-based programs in Alameda County. All awards will be distributed by the Alameda County Social Services Agency (SSA) utilizing a two-tiered system: 1) Large FCC & Center-based programs (Licensed capacity for 12 or more children) with grants of \$3,350; and 2) Small FCCs (Licensed capacity for eight or less children) with grants of \$2,350.

Harassment Avoidance Training

The recent passage of [SB 1343](#) expands the AB1825 training requirement, **mandating employers with five or more employees to provide two hours of anti-harassment training** for supervisory staff, and one hour of anti-harassment training for non-supervisory staff. All employees must be trained within six months of being hired and every two years thereafter.
