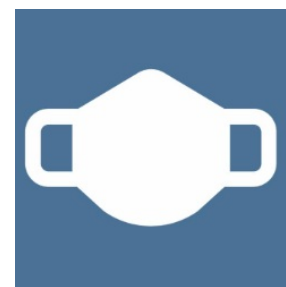




## CDC Updates Guidelines re: Isolation and Precautions for People with COVID-19

## Microbusiness & Non-Profit Grant Deadline Extended to October 19, 2022

Apply by October 19, 2022 at 5 p.m.

- This program will provide \$2,500 grants to qualifying microbusinesses and nonprofits in the counties of Alameda, Amador, Contra Costa, and El Dorado
- Must have been in operation in 2019, are still in operation, and were impacted by COVID-19 public health restrictions

The deadline for the \$2,500 grant for microbusinesses and non-profits has been extended to October 19, 2022. The grant application period began May 17, 2022.

The grant program, funded by the California Office of the Small Business Advocate (CalOSBA) and administered by the Chabot Las Positas Community College District (CLPCCD), is available for microbusinesses and non-profits in the counties of Alameda, Amador, Contra Costa, and El Dorado.

The program provides grants of \$2,500 to microbusinesses (businesses earning less than \$50,000/year with less than five employees) that were in operation in 2019, are still in operation, and were impacted by the pandemic.
