October **Aqua Aerobics** had a total of 374 total participants.


EASTERN DUBLIN CELL SERVICE AND COVERAGE SURVEY

What's New in Dublin



Delah Coffee is planning to open a coffee shop at 6694 Amador Plaza Road, Unit W.

Babaldeep Kaur, DDS, will soon take over the previous Pannu Dental Group location at 7137 Dublin Blvd., Unit A, offering dental services.

Grand Prospects Financial & Insurance, a new financial services provider, plans to hold its grand opening on November 8, 2024, at 7080 Donlon Way, Unit 107.

Financial tech company **SavvyMoney** renewed its 18,740 SF lease for six years at 4160 Dublin Blvd.

City Staff nominated Dublin-based companies, **SavvyMoney** and **Wellnest**, for the East Bay Economic Development Alliance Innovation Awards.

PG&E PAVEMENT RESTORATION

Neighborhood Around Bloomington/Southwick



PG&E's contractors have progressed on asphalt and concrete restoration along Southwick Drive, Fenwick Way, and Fenwick Place over the past month. The restoration is subsequent to PG&E's gas and electric underground infrastructure upgrades in the Bloomington/Southwick neighborhood. Asphalt and concrete restoration is expected to be completed by March 2025, weather permitting. The final phase will be a slurry application and restriping of all affected streets, which will occur after the rainy season in May/June 2025.

The City has six permanent commissions/committees. For five of those commissions and committees, terms are four years, with a term limit of two terms. Terms are staggered so that some expire in December of every election (even-numbered) year. Terms for alternates are two years. The Mayor makes all appointments, subject to confirmation by majority vote of the City Council.

STAYING SAFE ON E-SCOOTERS AND E-BIKES

Know the Rules and Requirements for Operating Them



The City of Dublin and Dublin Police support e-scooters and e-bikes as eco-friendly ways to get around. To keep everyone safe, it's important to follow a few essential rules per the California Vehicle Code.

E-Scooters

- Two wheels, a motor, handlebars, and a standing floorboard
- Wear a helmet and ride solo
- Sidewalk riding prohibited
- Max speed: 15 MPH
- Riders must be 16+ with a driver's license or permit
- Dismount and walk for left turns
- Follow crosswalk and motor vehicle rules

Class 1 & 2 E-Bikes

- Pedal or throttle assist, max speed 20 MPH
- No license required
- Helmet required if under 18
- Allowed anywhere traditional bikes ride
- Sidewalk riding prohibited
- No minimum age requirement

Class 3 E-Bikes

- Pedal assist, max speed 28 MPH
- No license required
- Helmet required for all ages
- Allowed anywhere traditional bikes ride
- Sidewalk riding prohibited
- No minimum age requirement

Ride safely and enjoy the road responsibly!
